

## 2007 NOLYNN ASSOCIATION YOUTH CAMP (270) 325-3347

The basic purpose of the Nolynn Youth Camp is three-fold:

1. To present a program to our youth that will strengthen and enrich their lives in spiritual matters.
2. To provide our youth an opportunity to fellowship together.
3. To provide a recreational service for our youth within a Christian setting.

### GENERAL GUIDELINES

1. All activities provided are under the supervision of camp personnel and the Youth Activities Board.
2. Campers staying for part of the week are subject to the same rules and regulations as those staying the full week.
3. Each adult camper will be given a job to perform during the week. All adult campers must come to work and to contribute to the success of the camp.
4. An adult counselor will be provided for each dorm. The dorm counselors supervise and counsel those given into their charge during the week of camp. Counselors will conduct nightly devotions before "lights out".
5. A night watch will be kept during each night of camp to insure order and to provide safety for each camper.
6. Each camper should bring his/her own towels and personal grooming items. They shall provide their own sleeping bags/cots. All items should be marked to prevent loss or misplacement.
7. **Each camper should bring his/her Bible (King James Version only).** Other types of printed materials are prohibited unless authorized by the Camp Board.
8. The following fees **INCLUDE** a T-shirt: overnight campers- \$50, overnight campers 5 years and under- \$15. No one registering after the deadline will receive a shirt. Nightly charge is \$8 **plus** \$10 for a T-shirt. There will be a **\$10 penalty** on all **late forms**. Return form and fee to: **Sis. Shannon Kennedy, 195 Chase Lake Rd., Rineyville, KY 40162 by May 22, 2007.** Please make all **checks** payable to **Nolynn Youth Camp**. No fees will be returned.
9. The registration/release form must be completely filled out and signed by a parent or legal guardian, stating that they have read and will comply with camp rules and policies.
10. **Check-in will be Sunday, June 17<sup>th</sup> from 3:00-5:00 PM in the activity room. Campers need to be picked up shortly after clean-up and Team Presentations on Friday, June 22<sup>nd</sup> (approximately 3:00 PM). Parents please do not pick up your child before 3:00 PM since they need to help clean and not lose team points.**

## CAMP RULES

1. Campers and counselors are required to attend all flag raisings, classes, tabernacle services and camp fire services unless officially excused by a board member.
2. Campers are not permitted to leave the grounds or designated area without permission from a board member. Campers check out with the camp registrar before leaving.
3. Campers who have driven their vehicle to camp must turn in their keys to the camp registrar. **Parental permission (in person or by phone) is required before a camper will be allowed to leave.**
4. Athletic equipment and facilities are under the control of the recreation director and may be used as specified by him/her.
5. Quietness and attention and respect are expected during classes, Tabernacle services and camp fire services. Enter the Tabernacle with a spirit of reverence and leave as orderly as possible.
6. Campers and counselors are required to report to sleeping areas immediately after the last scheduled activity until the rising bell (or 6:00 AM for taking showers). No activity before 6:00 AM. Lights are to be off except in case of absolute necessity. Bathroom visits should be made before "lights out".
7. Electronic devices (ex. radios, tape/CD players, iPods, MP3 players, games, etc.) books, magazines and pets are not permitted without permission from the Camp Board.
8. Children who have **not** completed the 4<sup>th</sup> grade or reached age 10 will sleep with the adult who is responsible for them during the week of camp. All campers residing in the dorms will be under the supervision of camp personnel.
9. All campers of age will sleep in the designated dorms unless they can provide a doctor's statement of some physical, mental or emotional problem which they have.
10. Any case of illness, injury or infection must be reported at once to the camp nurse. Failure to do so may jeopardize the health of others and cause serious problems.
11. **All campers should follow the dress code.**
  - A. **Girls shall wear dresses or skirts to their knees or longer to all activities except from 2:00-6:00 PM.** Miniskirts are not allowed. No spaghetti straps, low-cut tops, exposed middles or exposed underclothes.
  - B. **Boys shall wear long pants except from 2:00-6:00 PM.**
  - C. Pants **BELOW** the knee or longer may be worn from **2:00-6:00 PM only. No shorts are allowed.**
  - D. The **dress code** applies to **campers, Bible school students and adults.**

Any problems concerning camp dress not covered by the above dress code will be left to the discretion of the activity supervisor and/or the Camp Board.
